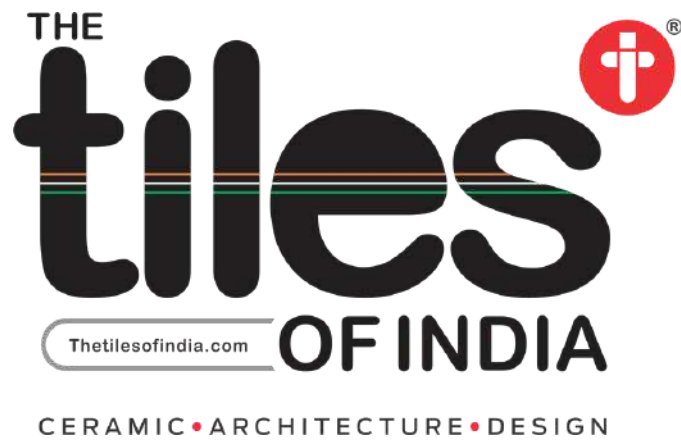


DELICATE ELEGANCE

Renzo Piano is one of the most renowned Italian architect of the 20th century, who is known for his contemporary projects around the world. He was born on 14 September 1937 in Genoa, Italy into a family of builders. Renzo studied architecture at the Milan Polytechnic University and graduated in 1964 with a dissertation about modular coordination supervised by Giuseppe Ciribini and began working with experimental lightweight structures and basic shelters. Following his university studies, he gained experience in Philadelphia and London, and the London experience, in particular, became a determining factor in his professional development, as Jean Prouvé assigned him the role of president of the project commission for the Centre Georges Pompidou.

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
